## 10 Common Leadership Myths



Leaders are born and not made.
 Leaders know everything.
 Leaders possess absolute power.
 Leaders are infallible (perfect).

 Leaders must be great public speakers.

Former US secretary of State Colin Powell says, "Good leaders are made not born. They learn from trial and error, and from experience. When something fails, a true leader learns from the experience and puts it behind him. You don't get reruns in life," Powell says. "Don't worry about what happened in the past."

### Biblical Leaders Also Had To Be Formed and Developed

- 1. <u>Moses:</u> He spent many years as a prominent figure in Egypt and witnessed the bondage of the Israelites and the cruelty of the Egyptians. After he was banned from Egypt, it took God about forty years to develop him as the deliverer of the Israelites.
- 2. **Joshua & Elisha:** Before they became great leaders and influencers, they both were under submission to their spiritual mentors. *Joshua* continually followed in the steps of Moses and observed everything that he did. Likewise, *Elisha* was faithfully serving Elijah and also observed how he executed the word of the Lord to His people.
- 3. <u>Daniel and Hedrak, Mechak & Obed-Nego</u>: Were taught and trained in the knowledge and culture of the Babylonians. This training took about three year and the Babylonian king only chose the smartest/wisest of the students.
- 4. <u>Samuel</u>: Before he became one of the greatest prophets of Israel, from his childhood years he still had to learn all the concepts, rituals and responsibilities of what it meant to be a prophet. Also, keep in mind that his spiritual leader Eli and his adulterous sons (priests) were not the best role models for his spiritual formation, but the Lord still matured Samuel in this ungodly environment.
- 5. **Esther:** It took a whole year just to have her physical body (appearance) pampered before she would stand before the king. But also keep in mind that she continually asked the eunuch's advice in regards to what the king enjoyed the most (clothing, color, smell, taste, ect). And I'm sure that this eunuch saw the unique difference in Esther and took the extra effort to council and to mentor her.

- 6. **Joseph:** Before he became second in command of Egypt (vice president), he had to go through harsh development, which also included in learning of the Egyptian language and culture and customs. His development journey took about thirteen years.
- 7. *King David:* Since his teenage years the Lord gave him opportunities to develop his warrior skills and was also preparing him to become a future strong leader over Israel.
- 8. <u>Saul (Paul)</u>: He was taught by the best religious leader of his time. But after his Damascus encounter with Jesus, Paul was lead into the desert for about three years where he personally received the knowledge and revelation of Jesus Christ. Even Paul with his caliber and Jewish background in knowledge said that he counts it all as rubbish in comparison to what he personally received from the Lord (Phil 3:4-8).
- 9. <u>12 Disciples of Jesus</u>: They were all regular individuals minding their own business and doing what they did every day until Jesus showed up into their life. It took Jesus about 3 ½ years to form and develop them into historical leaders (except Judas Iscariot).
- 10. *Jesus:* Studied the scriptures and the traditional customs as a young teenager. Even the scholars of His time were amazed to hear such wisdom and knowledge from a teenager when He taught them in the temple (Luke 2:46-47).

- *Leader Mentorship* is one of the missing keys in many churches for building and raising strong and credible leaders.
- We are good at throwing scriptures at one another in regards to who and what a leader needs to be, but not everyone can extend a coaching hand to teach and to demonstrate that in real life.
- Just like an apple tree can only reproduce more apples in accordance to its nature and ability, so it is the same in regards to leader reproducing more leaders.

# Jesus Rebukes and Exposes Church (Religious) Leaders of His Time

#### Matthew 15:14

Let them alone. They are blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind leads the blind, both will fall into a ditch."

#### Luke 11:52

"Woe to you lawyers! For you have taken away the key of knowledge. You did not enter in yourselves, and those who were entering in you hindered."

- Throughout the four gospels we continually observe how often Jesus rebuked the religious leaders (Pharisees, Scribes, Sadducees and Lawyers) of His time. Jesus saw how corrupt, selfish and abusive their hearts and actions were towards Gods people.
- The position of every leader is to serve others with the heart of God, but not to lordship over them. Jesus saw their wicked hearts and exposed them in the public. For this reason they hated Him and wanted to kill Him.
- Jesus gives us great insight to what a Godly leader is not supposed to be like and if the leader is blind, then they will lead others to destruction and downfall.
- The religious leaders in the days of Jesus had a lot of head knowledge and way too many manmade traditions, but were missing the true heart of God and the passion to serve others.

# Examples of Radical Leadership Growth and Development

- <u>Abraham Lincoln</u>: Born to uneducated farmer parents and also lacked formal education and charisma. Later in life had many political failures, but eventually became one of the greatest presidents in our history who has also abolished slavery.
- Frederick Douglas: Born in 1818 as a black slave, he self taught himself how to read. Later in life he escaped from slavery and eventually become an outspoken abolitionist, a spectacular orator, a bestselling author, and a newspaper publisher.
- Thomas Edison: Only received 3 months of formal schooling, because he got kicked out. He also lost most of his hearing when he was younger, but eventually became one of the greatest inventors with more than 1,000 patents.
- Milton Hershey: Dropped out of school after fourth grade and had an unstable youth since his family moved so often and eventually his parents separated. At the age 28, he became unemployed due to one of his business failures, but eventually founded the Hershey's chocolate empire to which we still lick our fingers to.
- <u>Walt Disney</u>: Had a rough childhood, since his father was a cold and abusive man with no affection. At age 16 he dropped out of school, but was a great dreamer and eventually built Disneyland, one of the world's most coveted family vacation spots.
- Mother Teresa: Was an ordinary nun who just wanted to help the needy. Eventually became the most talked about individual in just about any area of life, who has set the standard for serving and helping others.
- Ray Kroc: Dropped out of high school, but had a big dream and eventually bought out the McDonalds franchise with only few restaurants, since the McDonald brothers did not want to grow their business and eventually gave birth to the McDonalds empire.
- Arnold Schwarzenegger: Was born in a small village in Austria, whose father was cold and abusive. Became the youngest ever winner of Mr. Universe at age 20. Eventually became a world famous movie star and even surprisingly a governor of California.
